I have worked with some mothers to access Childcare qualifications so they can develop an income that fits around their lives. I help others to access advice from Citizens Advice, and support people to join Unions **s**o that their employment is protected. We're a community and we support each other. We are planning all sorts together, like sharing the dances and music from our cultures, to bring us closer together.
